Q: How can I register in the U18 League with Saskatoon Youth Soccer?

- Every player must fill out a Registration Form and they can be accessed on our website at www.saskatoonyouthsoccer.ca under the "Registration" tab. You can register as one player, request to play with a couple friends, or submit a whole team.
- The registration deadline is **Fri Sept 9 at 4:30pm**. After this date a \$25 late fee per player is in effect.
- There are two different ways you may register:
 - 1) Drop off the registration form and payment (cash or cheque only) to the office
Hand in the form and payment to the Saskatoon Youth Soccer administration offices at the SaskTel Sports Centre (South Entrance) during office hours Monday to Friday 10:00am – 4:30pm.
 - 2) Mail the registration form and payment (cheque only) to:

Q: What are the differences between joining youth or adult soccer?

- You cannot be registered on an adult team and youth team at the same time in the same season (including Adult Coed).
- To join youth soccer you can submit a team, a couple players, or an individual player whereas with adult soccer you need to submit an entire team and individuals without a team are placed on a waiting list.
- Adult games start as late as 11:15pm. The latest youth start time is 9:15pm at night.
- **The reason youth soccer fees are higher is because of the amount of zone support your team receives such as coach/manager support, uniforms, soccer balls, first aid kit and other equipment. Adult soccer does not provide coaches, uniforms or equipment for your team.**

Q: What do I need to know about the U18 Turf 7v7 League?

- All 20 games plus city playoffs will be played on half field turf at the SaskTel Sports Centre with a 7v7 format played with adult soccer rules. Season runs from the 1st or 2nd week of November to late March.
- Players born in 1993 cannot participate in provincials and must register with adult soccer in Outdoor 2011.
- There will be two levels of competition offered: Premier and Division II – both divisions will have playoffs and standings and SSA Provincial Competitions may be offered if the province receives enough entries.
 - 1) Premier Division ~ for players who have previously played PSL, Premier, or Div 2
 - 2) Division 2 ~ for player who have previously played Div 2, 3, 4 *(Girls Division 3 may be offered if there are enough teams)
- There are no tryouts at the start of the season but if you feel you have joined the wrong division after the season has started you can transfer to another division team.
- Players registered on an U18 turf team cannot permit to U18 boarded league game (and vice versa); unless you are registered in both leagues on an U18 boarded team as well as an U18 turf team.
- You may be registered on both U18 turf and U18 boarded leagues and schedules will not conflict one another, however you cannot be registered on an adult team and youth team at the same time in the same season including Adult Coed.

Q: What do I need to know about the U18 Boarded League?

- All 10 games will be played on hard court with live boards at the Saskatoon Kinsmen Henk/Ruys Soccer Centre with a 6v6 format played with adult boarded soccer rules. All games will take place on Fri, Sat, and/or Sun and the league will start 1st or 2nd week of November and finish at the end of January or early February.
- Players born in 1993 players must register with adult soccer in Outdoor 2012.
- This is considered a fun league with referees and standings but no provincials, playoff games, or medals. All levels of teams will play together (Divisions P, 2, 3, 4).
- Players registered on an U18 boarded team cannot permit to an U18 turf league game (and vice versa); unless you are registered in both leagues on an U18 boarded team as well as an U18 turf team. U16 lower division players cannot permit to the U18 Boarded league.
- You may be registered on both U18 turf and U18 boarded leagues and schedules will not conflict one another, however you cannot be registered on an adult team and youth team at the same time in the same season including Adult Coed.

Q: How do I register an entire team?

- A complete list of players expected to be on the team must be submitted by the team contact or coach/manager at the time of registration ~ maximum 16 players per team. Separate registration form for each player must be filled out and payments attached from all players.
- **TURF LEAGUE TEAM FEES:** Teams wishing to submit a list of players and not have SYSI add any additional players may do so but must pay a total amount of \$3507 plus \$89.50 per player (\$24.50 SSA Fees and \$65 Zone Fees). All players registered or added to your team after the deadline are subject to the late fee whether they are on your list of players or not. Teams with a lower roster than 14 players and are willing to have extra players placed on their team by SYSI just pay \$340 per player.
- **BOARDED LEAGUE TEAM FEES:** Teams wishing to submit a list of players and not have SYSI add any additional players may do so but must pay a total amount of \$1127 plus \$89.50 per player (\$24.50 SSA Fees and \$65 Zone Fees). All players registered or added to your team after the deadline are subject to the late fee whether they are on your list of players or not. Teams with a lower roster than 14 players and are willing to have extra players placed on their team by SYSI just pay \$170 per player.
- **Players registering in both Boarded and Turf Leagues** pay the SSA fee \$24.50 only once.
